Where Two or More Gather is one of two parts of Phase 2 in the Healing Pathway program. It includes learning surface anatomy of the neck and back and practicing specific healing sequences for these areas. Other aspects covered include the experience of group healing and support for practitioner growth towards wholeness. Emphasis is on development of self as an instrument of healing. Completion of Phase 1 is a pre-requisite.
